Until we get Square Dancing going again we are going to have start trying to get everyone to work gather on the foundation level of our activity and remember without a strong Mainstream we have just had it proved to everyone that square cannot ever come back. Today most SQ Dance clubs have from 2 to 3 squares dancing and are having a hard time getting people take lessons, because they are too long and too hard. We do not allow them time to enjoy even know how to do what they have learned and if you will be honest.

We have to get back to (You must stay in main stream for one year before they can go to plus, and this way we can maintain a foundation level.) For the last thirty years we have killed our foundation Level. By the time a new dancer got through Mainstream and in most cases the day after they got through Mainstream we had a Plus Dancer trying to get them into Plus class.

We must bring back the order that we had back when we allowed the new dancer to become a Square Dancer first and they cannot do it when we were pushing them into the next level when they did not have time to enjoy what they had worked so hard to get through in a Mainstream Class. The mainstream classes are the foundation of this thin Called Square Dancing. We must let them have time to enjoy what they have learned if we expect them to go out and get their friends for the next class and they will not do that when you are pushing them into the next level. I believe that it's time for the dancers to take back the leadership of Square Dancing and the callers go back to be paid employees of the square dancers. This is based on over 60 years of calling and teaching Square Dancing.

THE WAY IT WAS BEFORE ALL THE LEVELS

It's time for the dancers to take back their activity, for after thirty years of Callers telling them how to run the show you cannot get dancers to do anything except dance. They don't have time to help new folks that want to learn to square dance because they are too busy getting up the next level to even ask someone that does not dance to try it or to be there to help.

If this is to go on much longer we can look forward to not having any square dancing for anyone, the reason being all the levels. Dancers were one big Happy Family helping each other enjoying the friendship and fellowship of Square Dancing and we had Friendships that lasted a lifetime.

I do remember when we first heard of the start of the level ladder it was called Plus 1&2 and your were required to stay in Mainstream for a year to help the new Class and could NOT go to Plus one for one year and I cannot remember how long you had to stay in Plus but they did put 1&2 to gather and called it just PLUS. Keeping Mainstream and Plus separated gave the callers another night of calling and if they were teaching Classes for the clubs this gave them another night and they did not have time to manage anything except what they were being paid for and that's called working for the dancers, not telling them how to run their Square Dance Clubs.

But the callers were willing to help the club in any way that they could but not to run the club. We had very few callers run clubs. If Callers were doing their job that they were being pay for they did not have the time to run the Club, and they did not need to take that away from the dancers. When the dancers had nothing to do but Dance they did not feel like they were a part of the club and not willing to do anything to help.

We must get back to the Dancers being the ones that run Square Dancing clubs and the Callers have all they can do to do their job and help the dancers do a better job if they ask for help the caller should offer to help them on a one on one with the club officers this will have everyone in square dancing doing everything they can to make this a activity that grows and grows again and will keep everyone in the club happy for they will all feel like they are doing everything they can to make square dancing something that everyone will want to be a part off.

The reality is that ever one wants to do what they can to make square dancing grow and be something that people will want to be a part of something that brings people together again and caused them after they have had time to get to know all the dancers in the group. They will want to bring their friend into Square Dancing with them.

AS COUPLES MOVEMENTS are listed on the Callerlab Advanced List, do we realize how many Couple Movements are listed on the Basic and Mainstream List.

Their are "no" Couple Movements on the Plus List. Here are the Couple Movements on the Basic and Mainstream List.

- 6. COURTESY TURN
- 7. WHEEL AROUND
- 8. REVERSE WHEEL AROUND
- 9. DIVE THRU
- 10. LEAD TO THE RIGHT
- 11. LEAD TO THE LEFT
- 12. CIRCLE TO A LINE

- 13. VEER TO THE LEFT
- 14. VEER TO THE RIGHT
- 15. BEND THE LINE
- 16. WHEEL & DEAL
- 17. FERRIS WHEEL

(Helpful Hint) When doing AS COUPLES MOVEMENTS, put your center arms around each others waist as you go through the calls. This way there is one free left hand and one free right hand.

Heads or Sides **SQUARE THRU 4** SWING THRU Boys RUN FERRIS WHEEL Centers RIGHT & LEFT THRU And SQUARE THRU 3 SWING CORNER PROMENADE.

MAINSTREAM

Heads or Sides PROMENADE 1/2 **SQUARE THRU 4** RIGHT & LEFT THRU PASS THRU TRADE BY SWING THRU SPIN THE TOP SLIDE THRU SWING CORNER PROMENADE.

PLUS

Heads or Sides FLUTTER WHEEL PASS THE OCEAN SWING THRU PING PONG CIRCULATE EXTEND SPLIT CIRCULATE Boys RUN BEND THE LINE PASS THE OCEAN Boys RUN PROMENADE.

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
