## **Christina Wiggins-Harker Heights, TX**

As a brand-new caller, I have been acquiring as many informational helps as I can. That's not to say I have used all of them, but you never know when they will come in handy.

While attending the National

Square Dance Convention in June, I purchased the set of Caller Teaching Program Books for Basic, Mainstream and Plus from CTP. Little did I know how important they would become just a month later.

The summer program at our club consists of an hour of DBD Mainstream Workshop and an hour and a half of Plus Lessons. Every week, towards the end of our Mainstream Workshop, I would call a Patter and a Singer, so I felt somewhat comfortable with Basic and Mainstream calls.

Our club caller, Dan Clairmont, is the instructor for those classes. One night in July, about an hour and half before lessons were to start, Dan called to tell me that he was feeling poorly and wouldn't be able to trach that evening. I had three choices: One, I would quickly get a phone tree going and cancel lessons, Two, I could take care of the first hour and handle the Mainstream Workshop like a dance and get experience doing several Tips of Patter and Singers or Three, I could jump in the deep end and take care of the whole two-and-a-half-hour program.

I decided to option THREE. Although, I began to panic a bit. I had zero experience with calling any kind of Plus. The thing that gave me even the least little bit of confidence was that beautiful purchase I had mad at the Convention.

Dan had taught 20 moves from the Plus teaching list and all I needed to do was review what they had done up to that point. So, I marked all the pages that would apply to their level and reviewed Plus for an hour ana half!! I used the first one or two written figures on each page and got through. I surprised myself and my club with what I was able to do. They didn't hesitate to tell me they had been extremely skeptical when I told them I would be filling in for Dan.

With the definitions on each page, I was also able to walk through a call or two that they had forgotten how to do. It was a very positive experience and I owe it all to the pages you put so much effort into writing.

I have now started my first class, and I refer to your notes on a daily basis as I plan each lesson. Thank you for sharing your years of knowledge with those of us who are just starting out.
